

Weiden, Germany  
13 October 1945  
Saturday

Dearest Shirley,

Just a few lines to let you know where I am, how I am, and what has happened.

Thursday we left Starnberg and rode all day by truck thru Regensburg to Weiden and the 90th Infantry Division Hq. Thirty-one of us with points of 66 to 81 came here from the MRU. The 90th Division is ~~composed~~ composed of men with points of 60 to 69 so those of us with 70 and up do not belong here. We want out as the Division does not leave until late next month. We registered a complaint yesterday with the Inspector General and I registered a complaint today with the Personnel Staff Section. We should hear something Monday about whether or not we may get out of here. Tomorrow is a day off so can get no news till Monday.

In the meantime three of us are in the Surgeon's Section of Div Hq, three in G-2 Section, 1 in Chaplains section, and 1 in Hq Co. The rest of the boys were sent to one of the regiments. I want no part of this Surgeon's Section, its reports, its work, or this business of being stuck over here another month.

I'll let you know as soon as we hear any news — good or bad. Until then do not write to this address. I hope to get out of

here and soon. When I hear anything I will either let you know about writing hear or ask you to continue on a non-writing basis.

Pray, darling, that we may get out of here and into a unit going home soon. I am so tired of this d--- Army and its ----- screwed-up mistakes. I should have been on my way home long ago and now may be stuck another month and with another headache for a job.

Keep faith, though, honey. I'll get home yet. Remember always that I am yours and that I love you more than anything in the world.

Goodnight now, sweetheart. Give Laura a kiss for me and say your prayers for us.
