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Chaskiel Furberg, He was at the “Ostbahn” [Yiddish: Eastern Railway - U. M.] after that he appeared in Rakow concentration camp where he worked in transportation. Feifer was a chief and Heinrich was *fararbajter* [Yiddish: - U.M.]

Chaskiel Furberg escaped from the transport. After some time came he back and Heinrich met him at the bathhouse. Heinrich Dawidowicz told Feifer that Furberg was back.

I was called to Feifer and in few days we were able to manage the situation, claiming that Chaskiel Furberg has not been here and Heinrich should have been mistaken in recognizing him. Since then he stayed in factory in the shelter. I provided him with bread and blanket. I passed food and blanket to him through Zelwer or Kantor. Dawid Kantor asked me to take him to (...), but we didn't have a 100% confidence that it would work out, there was some risk. Kantor decided to stay in the shelter and until he was liberated there.

Szzyncer – Dr. Luntki

Witness Wolkowicz - Dr. Bretler with broken leg, after March 20, 1943 brought him to ghetto, and sent some Pole to ask Gliksman if he could come back to the ghetto. They joined the group going to the “Ostbahn” and arrived in the ghetto (at 1 o'clock).
