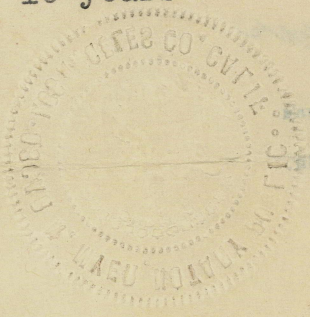

Declaration
Concerning the Reclamation of French Citizenship

In the year nineteenhundred forty eight, on February the
twenty fourth, before US, Justice of the Peace of the
twentieth district of Paris
appeared Mr. Kaufman, Michel
born in Lodz (Poland) on 15 June 1914
profession Machine tailor residing in
Paris, 32 rue des Cendriers
holder of an Identity Card 46 AE 03651
issued 1st October 1947 by the Prefect of Police
of Paris, valid from 1st October 1947 till
30th September 1950.

The applicant stated that his marriage to Mrs. Anna Zadner
born in Dobra (Poland)
on 21 May 1915 produced a child named Marie
(legally accepted) born at Albi (Tarn)
on March 19, 1941 residing

with her parents
and desiring, she still being a minor, to assure for her
the status of French Citizen, he claims on her behalf
French Citizenship according to the provisions of Article 52
of the French Citizenship Law.

In support of his declaration are attached:

- (1) Bulletin Nr.2 of the penal Registry;
- (2) a statement of morality and loyalty;
- (3) a protocoll relating to assimilation;
- (4) a medical certificate in conformity with the provision
of Article 8,3 of the decret of 2nd November 1945.

Mr. Kaufmann after having stated that he is not subject
to an extradition order nor to an order of forced domicile
has presented his permit of residence and has submitted to us

- (1) the birth-certificate of the minor in question;
- (2) the marriage-certificate of her parents;
- (3) all documents proving his residence in France for the
last five years.

These documents are attached to the declaration which will
be submitted to the Ministry of Population to be registered
there - the procedure being invalid without this formality.

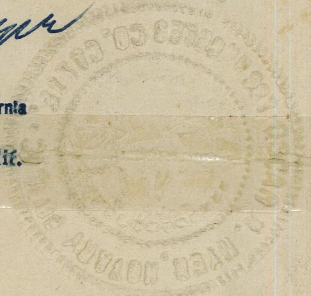
