

In November 1938 the Nazis began closing and absorbing Jewish owned stores as part of their Aryanization policy. The Brunn department store in Berlin was painted with signs, stars and caricatures before it was Aryanized.

Symbolic cemetery for ab. 750,000 Jews from Central Poland, Germany, Austria, Czechoslovakia, France, the Netherlands, Belgium, the USSR, Jugoslavia and other countries, on the premises of the former centre of immediate extermination in Treblinka. Here the Nazis also murdered Poles who aided the Jews. On 2nd August 1943 an armed revolt of the prisoners took place.

Monument on the premises of the former centre of immediate extermination in Chelmno on the Ner river, the scene of mass murder, with the aid of exhaust fumes from specially constructed cars of ab. 330,000 Jews, several thousands of Gypsies, ab. 5,000 Soviet prisoners as well as Czech children from Lidice and Polish children from the Zamosc district.
