I came over to relieve a temporary
shortage of labor. I expected to be home
in 4 months — that was in October last.
Here it is June and I am still here. It
is most discouraging. I am 2B with
Uncle Sam — a necessary man in an
essential industry.

Hawaii is not a bad place for the
first six months, but after that it ceases
to be the Pacific Paradise that the local
G of C claims. I can see where Hawaii
in peacetime could be a wonderful
place to ~~live~~ live but wartime Hawaii has
no South Sea Glamour and it exists as
a big Military reservation.

I'm located at Kahukū. It is on the
opposite side of Oahu from Honolulu. I
get into the big town once in a while
but there is really nothing to do there. All
you can do is buy junk at clip joint prices.
It's a most unsatisfactory situation. I get
to see a show every now and then
at a nearby Army theatre, but that and
occasionally a fishing spree constitute the
sole form of amusement.

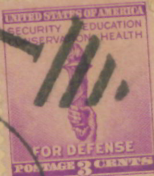
I look forward to going back to Bolinas
