Commander; 1915-18 General Staff Officer on the Eastern Front; after the war studied law; 1933 Oberstleutnant on the General Staff; Austrian Military Attaché in Paris; 1936 put on retired list owing to his NS sympathies; 1938 reinstated in German Army; appointed Chief of Staff XVII Army Corps; 1939 Generalmajor; 1940 G.O.C. an Infantry Division on the Western Front; 1941 Generalleutnant; 1941-42 G.O.C. a division on the Eastern Front; March 1942, Knight's Cross; Dec. 1942 General der Infanterie; March 1943 G.O.C. an Army Corps on the Eastern Front; Autumn 1943 G.O.C. a Panzer Army in the Balkans; Aug. 1943 Oak Leaves to the Knight's Cross; April 1944 Generaloberst; June 1944 C.-in-C. of German Troops in Lapland; approx. b. 1893, Wesel/Rhein; father Oberstleutnant; educated at Metz, Grenoble and London; studied languages; four years in Canada as an independent business man; returned to Germany in Aug. 1914; volunteered for active service; officer cadet; 1915 Leutnant; wounded; 1918 to Turkey as adjutant to the representative of the German war office; 1918 in the war office; 1919 adjutant to German delegation in Versailles; demobilised as Oberleutnant, and went into business in Berlin as owner of an export firm for wines and spirits, dealing chiefly with England and France; since 1930 worked for NSDAP.; joined Party 1932; after 1933 R. became Hitler's adviser on foreign policy; up to July 1935 dealt with questions of disarmament; on this date made ambassador; negotiated Anglo-German naval agreement; 1936-38 German Ambassador in London; made himself highly unpopular; 1937 negotiated Anti-Komintern Pact and Rome-Berlin-Tokyo

agreement; 4 Feb. 1938 Reichsaussenminister in succession to Neurath; his "private" Foreign Office, the "Büro Ribbentrop," was largely merged with the Foreign Office; married to daughter of largest German champagne manufacturer, Henckel. LD 1944.
